THE ELKS NATIONAL "HOOP SHOOT"® FINALS Absolutely Perfect! 10-11 year old girls champion shoots 25/25!

Destination: Springfield, Massachusetts for the 34th Annual Elks Hoop Shoot* National Finals. After months of hard work, perseverance, and friendly competition, seventy-two boy and girl Elks Hoop Shoot* finalists from across the U.S.A. reached their destination. Six of those finalists captured trophies and the privilege of having

their names enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts as the 2006 Elks National Hoop Shoot* Champions.

Silence hovered in the gymnasium at Western New England College on April 22, 2006. As the contestants focused, only the sounds of shooting basketballs and swishing nets could be heard. For Karlie Samuelson from Brea, California, there was plenty of net swishing to be heard. In a steady rhythm, the second-time Hoop Shoot* national finalist nailed 25/25 shots to capture first place in

the girls 10-11 year old category. She also won the prestigious Getty Powell Award for her stellar performance in the overall girls competition. Nicholas Fortenberry from Augusta, Georgia, scored an amazing 23/25 round to capture first place in the boys 8-9 year old boys category. He also won the coveted Getty Powell Award in a three-way shoot off with Kaden King and Caleb Donnelly. "I just had to focus and tell myself I would make it every time I shot," said Fortenberry. Both Getty Powell Award winners have been awarded a trip to the 2006 Elks National Convention in Orlando, Florida.

The 8-9 year old boys and girls performed liked seasoned shooters. Brandon Meija from Del Rio, Texas, sank a sparkling 22/25 shots to take sole possession of the boys second place trophy. Clayton Voss triumphed from a four-way tie for third place making 24/25 shots in a nail-biting five round shoot-off including Connor Clark, Colton Pitko and Jason Thibault. Their awe-inspiring efforts were applauded with a standing ovation. The girls competition could not have been any closer.

Lakyn Boltz from Keokuk, Iowa, captured the first place title with her outstanding 24/25 shot round. Spoken like a true veteran Boltz said, "I picked up basketball when I was really young and have loved the game since then." Autumn Whirley from New Paris, Ohio, was not far behind with her awesome second place finish of 23/25 shots while

Katie McWilliams from Salem, Oregon, scored an impressive 22/25 shot round to take home the third place trophy.

In the 10-11 year old boys and girls competition, repeat Hoop Shoot® champion Kaden King, from Central Valley, Utah, won the boys first place title with a steady 23/25 shot round. His winning ways have been inspired by his grandpa. "His best advice is 'Loosey Goosey' and to keep it all in line with confidence," said King. For second place, Gunnar Anderson from International Falls, Minnesota, and Collin Parker from Calhoun, Georgia, finished in a dead heat with a 22/25 shot round each. In a thrilling one round shootoff, Anderson sank 4/5 shots to capture the trophy and Parker finished with an admirable third place title. Besides the perfect first place title of Karlie Samuelson's in the girls competition, repeat finalist Kelsey Keith of Penokee, Kansas, nailed an extraordinary 24/25 shots to win the second place title while Corrie Reese landed an awesome 22/25 shot round to capture third place.

The exciting 12-13 year old boys and girls competition was decided by shoot-offs in both categories. Caleb Donnelly, of Hudson, New Hampshire and Kevin Flohr or Glenwood Springs, Colorado both shot a 23/25 round. In a one round shoot-off, Donnelly sank 4/5 to capture first place just edging out Flohr who's second place finish was top notch.

Donnelly attributes his success by "not letting the pressure get to me. I practice in my driveway, beating my own past numbers. A three-way tie for third place forced a two round shoot-off including repeat finalist Isaac Bianchini, Blake McNair, and Brian Shovlin. Bianchini won shooting a flawless 10/10 to capture third place. Kenzie Brader from Altamont, Kansas, won the first place trophy in the girls category by sinking an amazing 23/25 shots. "Practicing and remaining cool under pressure is what got me to the national finals," said honor student, Brader. All eyes

were on Ashley Backes from Bowler, Wisconsin, Liz Cruso from Westerly, Rhode Island, and two-time Hoop Shoot* champion Bonnie Samuelson, from Brea, California, for the second and third place title. Tied at 22/25, it took a magnificent five round shoot-off to determine the titles. Cruso shot a picture perfect 5x5 to capture the second place title edging out Samuelson by one point who went home with the third place trophy in the exciting 2006 National Hoop Shoot* finals.

Congratulations to ALL seventy-two national finalists – you are an inspiration to young and old across the U.S.A. And last, but not least, a sincere and heartfelt "Thank You" to all the wonderful folks from coast to coast, Lodge to nationals, Elks and non-Elks, who converged together in one of the biggest team efforts in America – the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. You, too, are an inspiration to young and old, modeling the integrity that contributes to the greatness of our country.
